After graduating from Austin-East, he joined the United States Navy. The Navy was both productive and non-productive for him. He traveled to many Countries and experienced various cultures, crossing the Equator twice. He participated in and survived the Viet Nam War.

The non-productive side began when he experimented with all kinds of illegal and very addictive drugs. By the time he made it back to the States, his outlook on life and the Country he was willing to die for, had drastically changed for the worse. Racial unrest and controversial issues over the war were at an all time high. This helped fuel his addiction and lead to illegal activities that eventually landed him in prison. After years of addiction and years spent in prison, God reached down from Heaven and chose him for His Service.

He walked through the doors of C.O.N.N.E.C.T. Ministries ten years ago and found God, his purpose in life and himself. He is now the Senior Life Coach, Mentor and President of the Men's Round Table, a support group for men about men with issues specific to those who are surviving the effects of incarceration. The Table helps those who are being released from incarceration and those who desire to become productive members of society after incarceration with the help of God and each other.

- ◆ Contact a reentry program and/or an employment program. before and/or after release
- ◆ Report to Parole Officer as required! Don't violate before you get started!
- ◆ Stay away from Criminal Activities!
- ◆ Be on time for appointments
- ◆ Know the public transportation/Bus System
- ◆ Show Respect and Appreciation to all persons contacted for resources.
- ◆ Follow through with directions and advice given by professionals
- ◆ Secure Housing, Food and Clothing
- ◆ Stay in a Positive Living Situation
- ◆ Get your ID/Dr. License, Birth Certificate and/or Social Security in order to work!
- ◆ Get resume done
- ◆ Get a working phone number
- ◆ Dress to impress-what you present is what you have to offer
- ◆ Get Ready to Work!
- ◆ Sign up for Government Benefits if you are disabled and/or a veteran
- ◆ Find, Mental, Spiritual and Physical Health Resources and Support!
- ◆ Get Connected to a positive support network -family, church, and /or mentor.
- ◆ Make arrangements for Child Support
- ◆ Get Voting/Civil Rights Restored
- ◆ Clean up your record and get legal help for expunctions
- ◆ Open Savings and/or Checking Account
- ◆ Repair Your Credit
- ◆ Spend, Save and Share Your Money Wisely
- ◆ Find training programs that will increase employment Skills
- ◆ Be Patient
- ◆ GIVE IT TIME & Don't Panic when there is delay!
- ◆ Pray! You Can Do It!
- ◆ Finish What You Start

- Don't ask your Mentor for money!
- Keep relationship in office or public setting to start.
- Conduct all business in the office or public environment.
- Always Male to Male Mentors and Life Coaches.
- Always Female to Female Mentors and Life Coaches.
- Start Personal Plan- Work-with other agencies who will also provide needed services, this builds successful support networks.
- Work the "Wrap-Around Service" plan with your Mentor/Life Coach.
- Encourage, Support, Listen and Learn from each other!
